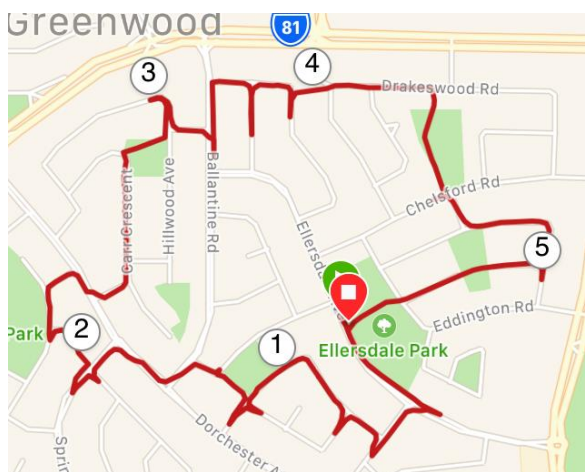

Other Hash Events including Next week's run:

The Hash That Never Was

Since this is a hash with no number attached to it then you don't have a run fee. It will be something different for those wanting to participate.

1. Hash Venue; Victoria Street Railway Station Mosman Park.
2. Runners leave at 7.07pm.
3. Walkers jump on the train at 7.07pm to the next station = North Fremantle and then start walking.
4. Drink stop Swan Hotel 201 Queen Victoria St, North Fremantle just before the bridge.
5. Runners and Walkers together into Fremantle to the Australian Pub Beach Street.
6. Walk to the Fremantle Railway Station and catch the train back to Victoria Street and your car.

This leaves hashers with any number of options.

1. Park at Vic Station.
2. Walkers park at North Freo Station.
3. Walkers and Runners set off from Vic Sta. - walkers go one extra stop.
4. Hashers can drive to the pubs and forget about the run/walk.
